GENESIS AND EVOLUTION

Mr. John Baldwin, who self-educated through janitorial work and wood chopping, dedicated himself to the cause of education. In 1845, he founded the Baldwin Institute in New York, followed by the establishment of Baldwin High School in 1882.

The Baldwin School for Girls was founded in Bangalore in 1903 and continues its dedication to providing quality education to girls. Recognizing the need for post-schooling education for women, the PUC section was established in 1990. This initiative was expanded with the introduction of the Degree section in 1995.



MANAGEMENT AND AFFILIATION

The Baldwin Women's Methodist College is managed by the Methodist Church in India with the Bishop of the South India Regional Conference as the Chairman of its Board.

The Pre-University Course approved by the Karnataka Government, comes directly under the purview of the Pre-University Education Board of Karnataka State. The Degree college is affiliated to the Bengaluru City University and recognized by the Government of Karnataka.

FACULTY

The college's dedicated faculty is its cornerstone. Lecturers surpass traditional classroom boundaries and organize workshops, seminars, educational trips, and industrial visits to enrich students' learning experiences. In addition to their regular teaching duties, they devote time to counseling students and offering valuable guidance.

HOW TO APPLY?

1. Applications can be obtained from the college office and are also accessible on the college website.
2. The application forms, completed in the applicant's own handwriting, must be submitted to the office by the specified deadline. They should be accompanied by attested photocopies of the following documents:
 - a) Statement of marks obtained in the last examination.
 - b) Transfer certificate from the institution last attended.
 - c) Latest caste certificate for students belonging to SC/ST/OBC categories.
 - d) Migration certificate for students from CBSE/ISC/Others or those relocating from other states.

EXAMINATIONS

1. There will be two tests in each semester. These Marks will add up to their internal assessments marks.
2. Internal Assessment Marks includes marks assigned for assignments, 2 tests and attendance .

Students resorting to unfair means during examinations will face disciplinary action.

ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT FOR FINAL EXAM

1. As per the Bengaluru City University Rule, 75% attendance is mandatory in all subjects and every semester.
2. Hall tickets will not be issued for semester exams if any student has attendance less than 75% in any subject and has not cleared the fees.

GENERAL RULES

- ◆ The morning session's first hour will begin after a prayer.
- ◆ Students are required to greet the lecturers politely.
- ◆ Inattentiveness, insubordinate behavior, or rudeness towards lecturers will result in disciplinary action, including the issuance of a transfer certificate after due warning.
- ◆ Students must wear their identity cards at all times on campus and are advised to check the College Notice Board daily.
- ◆ Strikes and similar demonstrations are prohibited, but respectful representation of grievances will be addressed.
- ◆ Students are not permitted to circulate books, pamphlets, or papers, nor sell tickets for any program within the premises without the permission of the Principal/Manager.
- ◆ No fundraising or gift-giving to staff members or others is allowed without the permission of the Principal/Manager.
- ◆ Students are not allowed to meet visitors in the College; all correspondence should be addressed to their homes or hostels.
- ◆ Students are expected to adhere to a modest style of dress within the premises, such as wearing Salwar kameez or jeans with long kurtas only. Non-compliance may result in disciplinary action from the management.
- ◆ The use of mobile phones is strictly restricted within the college building.
